

Directions to Rockmount Equestrian Corp.:

825 Churchland Ct., Saugerties, NY 12477

Coming from areas south of Saugerties -

Take Interstate 87 north to Exit 20. Follow Route 32 towards Saugerties. Then turn left after the toll onto Route 212 and go approximately 1 mile. Then turn left onto Churchland Road. Then go 1 mile and turn left on to Churchland Court.

Coming from the areas north of Saugerties -

Take Interstate 87 South to Exit 20. Follow Route 32 toward Saugerties and turn left after toll (approximately 500 yards) and then turn right onto Route 212 for approximately 1 mile. Then turn left onto Churchland Road. Then go 1 mile and turn left on to Churchland Court

Directions to Schunnemunk Shadow Stable:

99 Purdys Lane, New Windsor, NY 12553

Coming from the Five Corners in Vails

Gate, take Route 94 west for 1.8 miles, past Cornwall High School to left on Purdys Lane. Follow to end.

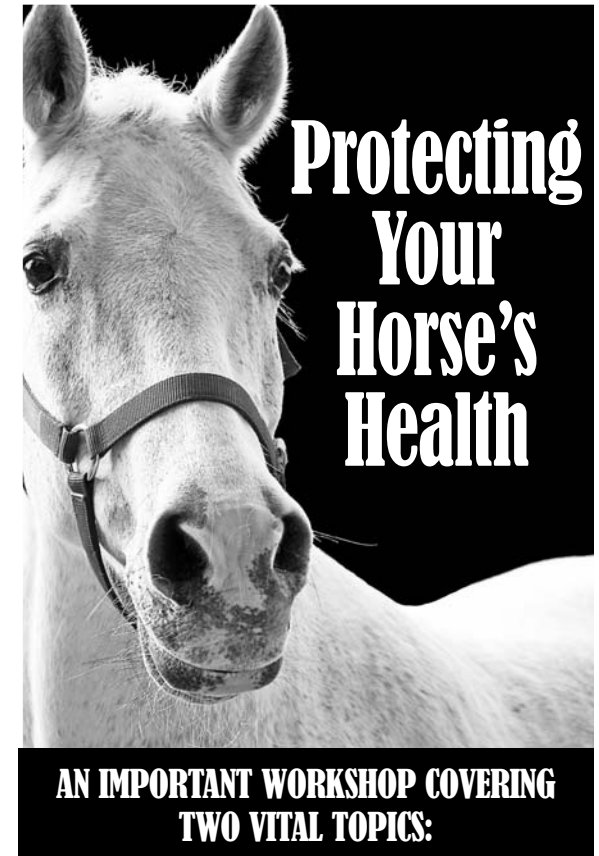
Coming from the west on Route 94 -

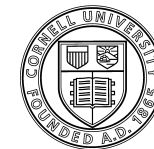

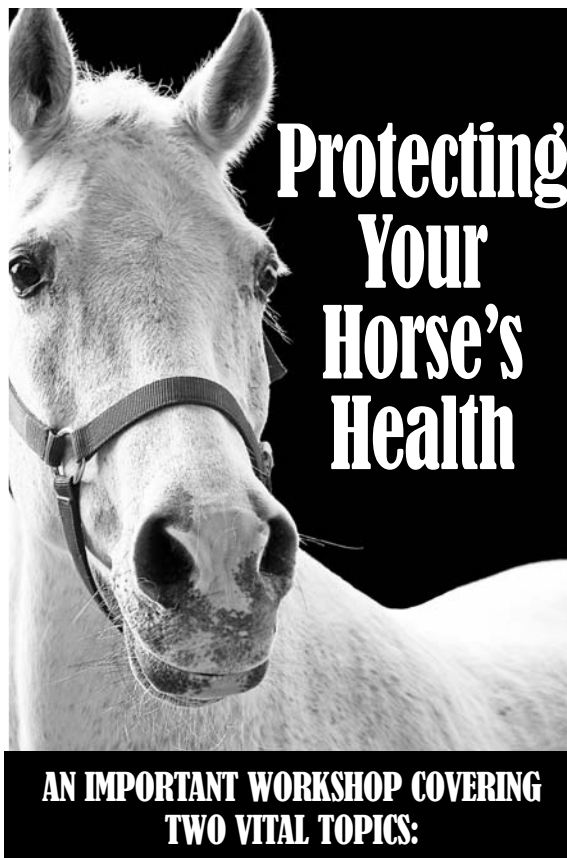
